Genesis 17:1-2 When Abram was ninety-nine years old, the LORD appeared to Abram, and said to him, "I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless. And I will make my covenant between me and you, and will make you exceedingly numerous."

Mark 8:31-33 Then Jesus began to teach them that the Son of Man must undergo great suffering, and be rejected by the elders, the chief priests, and the scribes, and be killed, and after three days rise again. He said all this

quite openly. And Peter took him aside and began to rebuke him. But turning and looking at his disciples, he rebuked Peter and said, "Get behind me, Satan! For you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things."

The two main characters appearing above present quite a conundrum. Abram (Abraham) is 99 years old "He is as good as dead" as someone, commented. However, as he looks at his ancient decaying body, he believes in God's promise of life. On the other hand looking into Peter's mind shows us his dreams of being the King's right hand man. This is a barrier to new life because he cannot accept Jesus' calling. 'That he (Jesus) must suffer and die, in order to rise again." [Lk24:46].

Lent can be a disturbing time for Jesus followers, it should however offer in equal measure both challenge and opportunity, beyond a month abstinence from chocolate. Challenge to the status quo and the comfortable rhythms of life that we can all fall into and an opportunity to grow through reframing our faith in today's world. For many of us that might feel like a bridge too far. Actually coming to church is step away from the daily grind of life and is an opportunity to step into the familiar and safe. Church for the faithful remnant is like home but "the times are changing" and many Church goers see their homeward stretch coming into focus on the horizon. The God who fills believers with hope and promise is moving ever closer. Just as Jesus inevitably faces the cross, we too during Lent stand face to face with our own morality. 'From dust you came and to dust you will return, repent of your sin and follow Christ,' is the Ash Wednesday call to faithfulness and the observance of Lent.

The Ashes are a sign to the world that we belong to Jesus. The gravity of the clock tick-ticking is calling to us as we learn to accommodate the compromises ages presents, as we watch the nest slowly empty and fill like the turning of an egg timer. There are many comings and goings these days making us more even aware of the dust, from which we come, is the same dust to which we will slowly return.

Abraham's faith is his badge of office. The God of Abraham is our God too. God has kept his promises. Abraham is the father (even in old age) of many nations and he is the father of all who believe from whichever ethnic background one might come. The Apostle Paul too affirmed that faith is open to all. Galatians 3:²⁸ reads, "There is neither Jew nor Gentile, neither slave nor free, nor is there male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." God gives life to the dead and calls non-existent things into being such is the faithfulness of our creator God: that same life appears in the Gospels as the man Jesus Christ.

Peter lacked faith. He was only able to see the world, as he wanted it to be. He was unable accept the costly, grace ridden way of the cross, which is the way of faith, the way to new life. Yet to all who received him, to those who believed in his name, he gave the right to be called the children of God." [Jh1:12] whatever ones preclusions might be, whoever you are. Faith is a joy, and a way of life available to all people.

CHRISTIAN AID WEEK

- * Before 1810, a visit to church probably meant a six mile round trip to Kirkburton. In that year, a Chapel of Ease was built on "School Lane". This was used by several denominations the Church of England, Wesleyan Methodists, Independents and Quakers. After 24 years, the C of E having a majority of trustees, excluded the other preachers from the pulpit and put the chapel under the patronage of the Vicar of Kirkburton. (This was not done peacefully!) The Methodists built their own chapel in 1837. You can see the position of the Chapel of Ease as a small square to the south on the more detailed map of 1893, and it is now part of the graveyard of St Thomas's, consecrated in 1870.
- * The advertised talk on February 13th, given by Mark Eastwood, the MP for the Dewsbury constituency, gave informative details of the boundary changes which will affect the whole village in the next election. It was followed by a question and answer session.
 - * The village will be celebrating D-day on June 6th with a performance from the village choir (and fish and chips) at the Rose & Crown, as well as the lighting of our beacon.
- * Don't forget the Monday Meetings at the Cricket Club on the second and fourth Monday of the month!
