Ten Years of the Anglican Diocese of Leeds

Events to mark the 10th Anniversary of the Diocese of Leeds on Saturday, April 20 began with a special visit by Stephen Cottrell the Archbishop of York.

Stephen as he prefers to be called met clergy and lay members from communities in different settings across our large and diverse diocese. Members of Christ Church met with Bishop Stephen at the Jo Cox More in Common Centre at Huddersfeild University on 21st April.

Archbishop Stephen said, "The roots of the Christian faith go deep in this lovely bit of Yorkshire where you serve. It's a diocese I know and love. I'm praying that God will richly bless you and that through my visit, God will open doors of opportunity for us to witness to Christ."

Archbishop Stephen was welcomed to the University by the vice chancellor Professor Bob Cryan and he was interviewed by the Bishop of Huddersfeild, + Smitha. Archbishop Stephen talked to us about prayer and the primary position it occupied in his daily routine. He went on to talk about making space to flourish, and that the Christian story positively encourages restarts and new beginnings.

Archbishop Stephen always encouraging and always smiling reminded us that sometimes life can feel like we running up the down escalator, he suggested that when we stop running we might note there is also an escalator for going down! Always witty and warm he was asked from the floor about government and his work in the House of Lords. He was keen to underline that he is not a politician, but mentioned the many pressing issues we might feel in our daily lives, social media security and scrutiny and conflict across the world. But he pointed to environmental issues as the single biggest issue we are facing as a human race.

Archbishop Stephen reminisced that he wasn't much of a saint nor was he rouge, as he had noted some of his predecessors had been. What he was was down to earth, approachable, understanding, pastoral, informed and attuned. Archbishop Stephen served as a Diocesan Missioner in the former Diocese of Wakefield and said he welcomed the chance to meet the people of our parishes, churches and cathedrals.

Former players are being invited to join us on June 22nd when the first team is at home to Emley so it will be good to renew acquaintances once more at an event which takes place every two years.



This aerial photograph from the early 1950s shows many of the oldest houses in the village — Upper and Lower Fold have several properties dating from the mid 17th century. The origin of our village is here on top of the escarpment where a 'Highroad' (Baintley) offered a route clear of the woodland lower down the hill. Still fairly compact thanks to a conservation belt, and surrounded by accessible fields, we have the good fortune that our village has maintained a look some of the 17th century residents could still recognise as home.

Visitors to our village often comment that Thurstonland has a good 'community feel' about it, which I'm sure is true, but it is a tenuous concept and relies on the good will of, in some cases, just a few folk. If you don't have children at the school, play or watch cricket, sing in the choir or go to the church or pub, you may not meet many villagers. (The coffee mornings at church and community meetings at the cricket club are a great way to overcome this problem!) The forthcoming Gala in July is run by a handful of helpers and the Village Association also relies on the help of just a few volunteers. Looking at its constitution, some of the TVA's aims are: To promote the interests and well-being of the village community as a whole; provide a link between different groups in the village by way of newsletters, email and the Thurstonland website and liaise/consult with relevant authorities/bodies as appropriate on behalf of the community." The website is being reborn soon, but the newsletter only appears once a year at the moment, emailing villagers proving quicker and easier. Even speedier is the village Facebook page, which has the advantage of sharing news with other village groups – this is useful in the case of lost property and raising awareness of local crimes etc.

Pentecost unlike Christmas and Easter doesn't have the same traditions or social events around it which make it stand out in the wider culture. Yet Pentecost is one of the most exciting of the church festivals for it marks the moment when God started the church! It is in effect the Church's birthday, the day that God sent the Holy Spirit to inspire and empower ordinary Christians to do extraordinary things in Jesus' name.

The Holy Spirit is given freely to all as a free gift from God. Jesus promised his disciples that they would receive

this gift so they might know Gods presence in living out their faith on a daily basis.

"And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another comforter to help you and be with you forever— the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you..."

- John 14:15-16

Most of us think of comfort when we think of the luxuries of life, or being wrapped up in a warm blanket. We also think of comfort as something that consoles us when we are upset or in need.

Whilst all these things are true the Greek word parakletos used in the New Testament has a completely different meaning. The word comfort is the same word that we find in relation to prodding, strengthening or stirring into action. The Bayeux Tapestry depicts Bishop Odo with club, forcing his men into battle with the abbreviated Latin words: which when translated means: "Here, Bishop Odo comforts his troops." As individuals we might not find such 'comfort' comforting but the Holy Spirit is given to equip and spur us into action! In fact, the word comfort has traditionally also meant to give or add strength to someone or to encourage, urge or exhort. When we see the coming of the Holy Spirit in that way it makes much more sense of both Jesus words and what we see in the book of Acts as the early church begins to emerge.

The Holy Spirit empowers believers to be the people God created and knows us to be, in that sense the Holy Spirit fills us with God's wisdom and power for the tasks which we are called. On the day of Pentecost it is the Holy Spirit that takes the group of timid and bewildered disciples and equips them to declare the gospel message. Jesus before his Ascension had promised them that they would receive the Holy Spirit to equip them as His witnesses throughout the world.

"But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth."

- Acts 1:8

This power that comes with the Holy Spirit is very real and is available to us just as it was to the first disciples. It is power to live our lives as God intended, power to encourage us and to strength us for acts of service. It is not to make us feel better, or for our own benefit but it is the power to build one another up and to inspire the Church. So as Pentecost approaches perhaps we need to re-imagine this Christian Festival and celebrate the birthday of the church with a bit more style and flair! Our prayer certainly needs to be 'Come Holy Spirit!'
