


The theme this year is "Routes, Networks & Connections". Our church will be open for visitors to appreciate all the Heritage of the church from 10am-4pm on Sat 14th September and 2-4.30pm on Sunday 15th September 2024 (this also the Yorkshire Historic Churches Trust "Open Churches Day"). A Messy Church event "A Walk in the Woods" will set off from church at 2pm on the Sunday with refreshments served afterwards. This is a family event and everyone is welcome. Please wear appropriate clothing and footwear.

Refreshments will be available when the church is open and any donations made on the day will be allocated to various projects to rejuvenate the church building. Booklets showing all the venues across Kirklees which will be open during this period will be available soon. Please see the posters for further information and come along to support this event.

As the days draw in and Autumn begins, the Gala, only two months ago, seems a distant memory! The good news is that the money it raised was £3,600 – a fantastic sum considering the weather forecast for the 7th July was uncertain. Memory of the Gala may fade but the money will continue to do good for the school, church and cricket club throughout the year. A big 'thank you' must go to the very



generous donations of villagers to the silent auction, the gala committee and all the other helpers for making it a great community day out.

Early September sees Heritage Open Days across the country. The theme this year is Routes, Networks and Connections. There will be talks in Huddersfield about the canal system and even one about the gasworks before the gasometer is demolished. Nearer home, the church will open specially on Saturday 14th, 10am til 4pm and Sunday 15th from 12 til 4.30pm with information about Thurstonland's connections and a tour for children to follow. Refreshments will be available

Part of our village communication network (a part many are unaware of!) is the railway line that lies beneath the village. As you can see from the 1960 map, it goes under the entrance to the Rec (and the ancient lavatories, thankfully demolished in the '70s!) There are signs above ground, however – the spoil heaps on either side of the road. The one with the air shaft is known to villagers, appropriately, as 'The Tipping.' The nearly mile-long tunnel opened in 1850 and its construction had led to the deaths of four workers. The first train to pass through came to a stop in the tunnel, but to find out what happened, you'll have to go to the open heritage days!

The weather has at last become a little more summer-like as the season enters the final third in terms of games remaining to be played.

The first team batting has been either boom or bust with scores in exceeding 250 being followed the next week by startling collapses. This has resulted in a fifty-fifty record and seventh place in our twelve-team section. A great deal of credit must go to our nineteen-year-old South African batter Bryce Jose who has scored three centuries and three fifties in a series of very stylish innings. Without his contributions our struggle for runs would have been even more pronounced.

His work as a wicket-keeper is also of the highest class and for good measure at the end of July he turned his hand to opening the bowling when holidays and injuries deprived the club of the services of several players.

The boom outlining the history of the club over its 150 year existence has been well received. It runs to 160 pages and has many coloured photographs of teams, match action and its attractive surroundings seen in all seasons of the year. Copies cost £10 and are available from the club with further details on the club website (www.thurstonlandcc.com). Other memorabilia items such as engraved pint glasses, pens, coasters and key rings are also on sale.

Junior fixtures end in early August with our social and awards presentation function scheduled for the beginning of September. Once again several of our Under 15 and Under 13 players have made appearances in the second team with several promising performances being noted. As ever, we are grateful for the support given by parents and other family members on match days and at practice sessions.



Thinking about love, giving and receiving...

"And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love." In 1 Corinthians 13:13, we find the most straightforward synopsis of the qualities that define a follower of Jesus: faith, hope, and love. But what do we mean when we talk about biblical faith, hope, and love today? Let's just pause for a moment and reflect on love.

- God's love is much more than simple feelings of affection; it is the strongest Truth in the universe.
- Love is commitment to God and to our neighbour; love leads people to put others first even when they are not "feeling" like it.
- Love shows itself in both words and actions: love is a whole lifestyle, not temporary emotions.
- It makes all the difference in people's lives whether an action is done out of love or not, even if the results of the two actions are otherwise identical God's kind of love always reveals itself.

Love is primarily unselfish: love cares more about the other than about ourselves, and is willing to sacrifice itself completely — as Jesus did on the Cross, the prime example of God's Love.
